National AI Research Resource (NAIRR) Pilot seeks datasets to facilitate AI education and researcher skill development

The National Artificial Intelligence Research Resource (NAIRR) Pilot,

managed by the U.S. National Science Foundation (NSF) in partnership with 12 other agencies, is soliciting datasets aimed at expanding access to AI research and education. This initiative is particularly focused on supporting newcomers to the field, enabling a wider range of researchers and educators to engage with the AI community. Through a Dear Colleague Letter (DCL), the NSF seeks



to identify datasets that can be utilized in classrooms, workshops, and other educational settings to promote AI skill development and contribute to building the nation's AI workforce. The selection criteria for these datasets are outlined in the "How to Respond to this DCL" section. NSF intends to feature the selected datasets via the NAIRR Pilot portal.
